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Guest Speakers



Professor Lisa Tucker

Lisa Tucker is a tenured Associate Professor of Law at Philadelphia's Drexel University Thomas R. Kline School of Law, where she teaches Family Law, a seminar on the United States Supreme Court, writing, and advocacy. Professor Tucker has published articles in the Duke Law Journal, the Indiana Law Journal, the BYU Law Review, the North Carolina Law Review, the NYU Review of Law and Social Change, the Georgia State Law Review, the University of Baltimore Law Review, the Journal of Air Law and Commerce, and the Journal of the Legal Writing Institute. She is under contract with Stanford University Press (with Supreme Court correspondent Tony Mauro) to write *Supreme Secrecy*, a book about the Supreme Court and transparency. For two Terms, she wrote the "Plain English" column for SCOTUS blog. Professor Tucker regularly provides commentary on the Supreme Court for NPR (Los Angeles, Portland, Philadelphia) and CBS Radio (Dallas/Ft. Worth). She blogs about law on the Huffington Post and appears regularly on Huff Post Live to talk about the Supreme Court. She has published op-eds in the New York Times, the Washington Post, the National Law Journal, the Philadelphia Inquirer, the Houston Chronicle, and several other papers and websites. She has been interviewed about the Supreme Court for the New York Times, the Wall Street Journal, the National Law Journal, Slate, Salon, Modern Health Care, the Huffington Post, and other publications. Professor Tucker is a graduate of Choate Rosemary Hall, Dartmouth College, the University of Michigan School of Public Health, and the Harvard Law School. After graduating from law school, she practiced with the Boston law firms of Testa, Hurwitz & Thibault and Gadsby & Hannah, LLP.



Mr. Coleman McCarthy

"I am a journalist for one reason—to use whatever skills I have to ease suffering in the world." For 30 years, Colman McCarthy was a columnist for the *Washington Post*. As the founder of the Center for Teaching Peace in Washington D.C. Professor McCarthy has been working to get American educators to see violence as learned behavior that can be overcome by adding comprehensive peace studies programs to the curriculum at the nation's 80,000 elementary schools, 26,000 high schools and 3,100 colleges. In addition, he is an adjunct professor at Georgetown University Law Center and the University of Maryland. He has appeared on national media programs such as *Crossfire*, *The Today Show* and *Weekend Edition* on NPR just to name a few. He continues to speak at colleges and universities such as Notre Dame, Johns Hopkins, American University, and Princeton teaching about peace and conflict. Followers of his writing cherish Colman McCarthy's work for the passion of his convictions and his idealism. He convincingly and passionately calls on students to defy the status quo and become more involved in the lives of others. When asked to teaching a writing course, his response is "I'd rather teach peace".



Mr. Karl C. Colder

Karl C. Colder is currently a Special Agent in charge of the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) Washington Division Office. For over thirty years, Mr. Colder has been in charge of directing global investigations, internal affairs and compliance investigations. His current duties at the D.E.A. include directing all DEA enforcement operations in Maryland, Virginia, Washington D.C. and West Virginia. Prior to his time as head of the Washington Division Office, he was the Deputy Chief Inspector of Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR). Through this position, Mr. Colder was able to continue the long standing professionalism, credibility and reputation within the agency. In 2010, Mr. Karl Colder was selected to co-chair the DEA's Diversity Committee. This committee helps coordinate diversity initiatives with the Attorney General's Office. This is Mr. Colder's 5th year as a special agent with the D.E.A. but has been with the department since 1998.
